Interview as a Method for Qualitative Research

A qualitative research interview seeks to cover both a factual and a meaning level, though it is usually more difficult to interview on a meaning level (Kvale, 1996) Interviews are particularly useful for getting the story behind a participant's experiences The interviewer ...

INTRODUCTION TO QUALITATIVE DATA

Most often interviews are thought of as being qualitative material, and sometimes even exclusively introduced as the only qualitative research material It is indeed the case that in the 'interview society' (Gubrium and Holstein, 2001; Silverman, 2013), interviews are used extensively by the mass media and professional services

Structural aspects of qualitative research interviews also differ from clinical interviewing. In qualitative research interviews, there is typically an interview guide created specifically for the research study being conducted, and questions are designed to open opportunities for the participant to reflect on and engage with the topic of interest.

Qualitative Research Methodology in Social Sciences and ...

Qualitative researchers are interested in people's belief, experience, and meaning systems from the perspective of the people. Qualitative research does not include statistical analysis and empirical calculation [Brink, 1993]. The roots of qualitative research lie in social and cultural

A Narrative Approach to Qualitative Inquiry

INTRODUCTION When selecting a research design, such as quantitative, qualitative, or mixed methods, Patton (2002) suggested reflecting on the purpose of the inquiry and the types of answers you seek. Qualitative methods allow the researcher to study issues in depth with data collection often occurring through open-ended questions.
